On Saturday 15th March, students from across the Trust gathered with Diocese members and Bishop McKinney for CYMFED Flame Congress 2025. Hosted at the OVO Arena in Wembley, this event is the UK's largest Catholic youth conference, drawing over 10,000 attendees every year.

The day featured music from Guvna B, Adeniké Adewale, Lily Jo and One Hope Collective, inspiring talks from speakers like Bear Grylls and Brother Chris Patiño and performances from the World Youth Dance Crew.

It was a joyful celebration filled with worship, prayer, and community. A huge thank you to all the young people and staff who represented the Trust and our Diocese.













Inspiring Conversations Shape the Future at Trust Synod 2025

On 21st January, we held our second session of our Trust Synod, bringing together over 200 participants representing the whole of our CMAT community. The inspiring conversation centred around the three themes of Relationships, Pathways and Places.

A Synod is a time for voices to be heard and for subjects to be approached, allowing the Catholic church to continue to grow in inclusivity.

Understanding other people's opinions and suggestions enables the church to move forward along with future generations.

The thought-provoking dialogues at our event will shape our Trust strategy and how we grow and move forward together.

Holy Trinity Hosts Lenten Prayer Stations






